Have you ever wondered how Avenidas Village programs and activities are determined? You can become a part of that process by serving on the Village Advisory Council! The Advisory Council provides leadership and guidance to the Village. All of our initiatives, including programs and activities, originate with the Council. It is a working body whose members chair or serve on the various Village committees, neighborhood cluster groups, and task forces. Belonging to the Council provides members with a broad overview of the full range of Village activities and with a significant opportunity to impact the program.

Members of the Village Advisory Council are expected to:

- Attend bi-monthly council meetings to receive Village updates and give input on any decisions on programs or activities
- Be active participants in their neighborhood clusters as well as a special interest group or Village committee
- Represent the Village and share information with prospects during recruiting events or individually as requested
- Have good general understanding of the various Village programs, activities and benefits

Annually, we call for nominations for new Council members who can help to provide direction and support to the Village program. Nominations for membership in the Advisory Council are due on May 17 for a two-year term beginning July 1. We have included the nomination form with this newsletter, and you can use it to volunteer (nominating yourself) or nominate another member to serve. We invite each of you to step forward and join us in charting and creating our future development. Take the opportunity to share your ideas for the Village and help bring them to life!

Village Geriatric Healthcare Interest Group: Focus on Fall Risk and Prevention by Chuck Sieloff, Group Lead

April's Zoom session of the Geriatric Healthcare interest group focused on one of the biggest healthcare issues we all face: the risk of falls and how to prevent them. We first heard from Dr. Jason Bae, an urgent care physician at PAMF, who helped us understand why older adults are more susceptible to fall risks and why the consequences are likely to be more severe. While the statistics are sobering, Dr. Bae left us with the positive message that "falls are preventable." The second part of the session was led by Villager Ron Lambert, who teaches an extensive course in fall prevention for the Avenidas Senior Center. Ron's course is based on the principles of SAIL (Stay Active & Independent for Life), "an evidence-based strength, balance and fitness program for adults 65 and older."

A recording of the 55-minute session, along with other related information, has been posted to our Online Resource Guide, which is easily accessible from the Welcome page of the Village members' website. Village Survey by Marcie Brown, AVAC Co-Chair

At the end of March, the Village Executive Team conducted a member survey asking Village members about physical or health-related limitations that could impact their participation in Village activities. We designed the survey to help us understand the nature of those limitations and, perhaps, to identify ways of minimizing the impact of those limitations.

We specifically asked those that did not have limitations to not respond to the survey. Also, we asked members if they were responding for themselves or for a member in their household.

After we closed the survey, we had 43 responses. We are in the process of analyzing the results, which we will discuss at the next meeting of the Advisory Council on May 13th. Thank you to those that participated and to those that did not.

Can psychedelics have a therapeutic benefit as psychiatric treatments? Dr. Annis will review some of the latest work being done to study their uses and potential effects on patients. Frank Annis, M.D. is a psychiatrist trained at Johns Hopkins and UCLA, researching chemical and behavioral effects of psychiatric medicines. His specialization is in Psychopharmacology and clinical psychiatry. Dr. Annis is now studying the potential of newly available medicines for psychiatric treatment. He has also been working to help develop DeepBow, a new non-profit organization dedicated to deepening our relationships to ourselves and the world through a lineage of Zen Buddhism.
